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## INFORMATION PERTAINING TO THE EXPERT WITNESS AND MEDICOLEGAL OPINION

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### Summary of Urological Expertise

#### 1. RENAL STONES

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I have worked extensively as a urological specialist, carrying out both open and endoscopic procedures on the kidneys and ureters. My particular focus has been on stone disease, and I have conducted basic science research on stone diseases in Manchester.

#### 2. SCROTOGENITAL DAY SURGERY

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My urological day surgery experience is considerable, with a strong emphasis on minimally invasive techniques. Most scrotogenital procedures, such as circumcision, vasectomy, vasectomy reversal, removal of epididymal cysts, varicoceles, and testicle removal, can be performed as day cases.

#### 3. GYNAECOLOGICAL INJURY TO THE URINARY TRACT

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With over 20 years' experience, I have managed major surgical complications following gynaecological surgery, including perforated bladder, fistulae, ureteric damage, and bladder distention. I gained significant expertise in this area while working at the trauma centre in QMC Nottingham.

#### 4. MANAGEMENT OF NEURO-UROLOGY – CAUDA EQUINA

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I am experienced in the urological management of complications arising from spinal cord injuries. My expertise also includes the diagnosis, treatment, and evaluation of Cauda Equina Syndromes.

#### 5. PROSTATE CONDITIONS

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I am fully conversant with the operative management of benign prostate disease, including transurethral resection (TUR), as well as the management and diagnosis of prostate cancer.

#### 6. PAIN SYNDROMES

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Over the past 10 years, I have developed a keen interest in urological pain syndromes, including painful bladder syndrome, urethral syndrome, prostatitis, pelvic pain of urological origin, and chronic testicular pain.

#### 7. MALIGNANT DISEASE OF KIDNEY AND BLADDER

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I have been responsible for clinical governance at Kingsmill Hospital and regularly present urological cancer cases at our weekly cancer multidisciplinary team (MDT) meetings. My surgical experience in renal and bladder cancer is extensive, having worked for several years at Sherwood Forest Hospital Trust.

#### 8. ANDROLOGY AND MALE HEALTH

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I currently practise as an andrologist specialising in erectile dysfunction, Peyronie's disease (penile curvature), penile implants [not do them anymore], and other complex male health issues. Andrologists typically manage specialised conditions, including:

- Male Infertility: Investigating low sperm count, azoospermia (absence of sperm), and conducting surgical sperm retrieval or vasectomy reversals.
- Sexual Dysfunction: Treating erectile dysfunction (impotence), premature ejaculation, and low testosterone (hypogonadism).
- Penile Conditions: Correcting Peyronie's disease (penile curvature), phimosis (tight foreskin), and performing penile reconstruction or implant procedures.

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- Testicular Health: Managing varicoceles (enlarged veins in the scrotum), hydroceles (fluid sacs), undescended testicles, and testicular cancer.
- Surgical Procedures: Performing vasectomies, circumcisions, and gender affirmation surgeries.

## 9. URINARY INCONTINENCE

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I am highly experienced in managing urinary incontinence, including genuine continent treatments, urinary incontinence therapy, Botox injections into the urinary bladder, and artificial urinary sphincter [not do them any more] and operations for genuine stress incontinence. My expertise also covers procedures such as colposuspension and previously mesh-based treatments.

## 10. GENERAL UROLOGICAL CONDITIONS

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In addition to the above, I am well versed in general urological conditions, such as prostatitis, urinary tract infections in women, loin pain haematuria syndrome, and investigations for visible haematuria.

- Studied the growth rate of calcium oxalate stones in artificial urine (AU) and AU supplemented with macromolecules leading to a submission of a thesis towards MSc degree.
- Most *in-vitro* experimental urolithiasis research involves crystallisation. We sought to develop a system, which was suitable for the experimental investigation of calcium oxalate stone growth. We tested the hypothesis that the growth rate of residual stone fragments following ESWL is related to the surface area.
- A model was developed which was suitable for studying the kinetics of calcium oxalate stone growth and the effects of urine composition, flow rate and macromolecular components.
